Miniature villages and buildings for a fictional town of Whimsey-on-Why. Each building is individually identified with a small number enclosed in a circle, usually found on the back or in a corner. Four sets of eight and one set of four were issued.

Mini Mansions / San Francisco's Painted Ladies (1984 – 1986)

A set of five ornately decorated tall Victorian homes. A tiny cable car is included with the set and each piece is identified with SF/#. The houses are numbered 1-5 and the cable car is 6.

Produced at Wade's Irish pottery, Bally-Whim is the Irish equivalent of Whimsey-on-Why. These buildings were also identified with a number enclosed in a circle, displayed on the back or in a corner. Only one set of eight was issued.
